
SDG 1: No Poverty

FPTT Iftar Contribution 2024









The FPTT Iftar Contribution Programme is an initiative aimed at providing iftar meals to orphanages and underprivileged groups (asnaf). 
Reaching Out to a New B40 UTeM Student


Petronas BeDigital Bootcamp Southern Zone Programme

Self-Instructional Material (SIM) Development Course for Open Distance Learning (ODL)

High-Impact Professional Malay Language Course







This program highlights that women are not left behind in celebrating Hari Terbuka Bakat Darat, demonstrating their active participation and contributions in various fields.


JELITA TVET Women Academy Visit to National Higher Education Fund Corporation (PTPTN)

Through this initiative, the goal is to foster a greater sense of responsibility and competency in energy management, thereby contributing to the overall sustainability efforts of CSC Steel Sdn. Bhd.

Upgrading and Replacement Works for the Central Air Conditioning System and Other Related Equipment at the Main Campus, UTeM











The upgrade and replacement work of the ducts for this central air conditioning system can enhance collaboration with local companies and industries, as well as provide employment opportunities for the local community. Furthermore, it promotes the efficient use of energy.


University Energy Management Briefing for New Students of the 2024/2025 Intake


Product Pitching Programme

By facilitating direct engagement with potential employers and industry professionals, the programme aims to significantly enhance the graduates' employability prospects, equipping them with the necessary skills and insights to successfully navigate the job market and secure suitable career positions.

Exhibition Malaysia Commercialisation Year (MCY) 2024



This exhibition session is organised with the aim of providing exposure and sharing information related to the innovation process and the commercialisation of technologies carried out at UTeM. Several companies have expressed interest in UTeM's products and technologies for commercialisation collaboration.

COMMUNITY PROGRAM @ UNIMADANI: SMART SOLAR-POWERED AQUAPONICS PROJECT @ KRUBONG







A handover ceremony for the smart solar-powered aquaponics sets was held for the residents of Kampung Tanah Merah, Krubong, as part of the Public University Community Empowerment Program (Komuniti@UniMADANI), sponsored by the Ministry of Finance Malaysia (MOF) and led by Dr. Mohd Rusdy Yaacob (FTKE).

The event began with an opening speech by Prof. Ir. Ts. Dr. Ghazali Omar (TNCPI UTeM), followed by an officiating speech from Mr. Mohd Khawari Fazmi Zulkifli, Secretary of Jeperun Paya Rumput, representing the Paya Rumput Assemblyman (ADUN). The program was also attended by Prof. Ts. Dr. Effendi Mohamad (Director of RICE) and Associate Professor Dr. Hidayat Zainuddin (Dean of FTKE).

This aquaponics project integrates aquaculture (fish farming) and hydroponics (soilless vegetable cultivation) into a closed-

loop system fully powered by solar energy, equipped with an IoT-based monitoring system.

A total of 8 aquaponics sets were distributed to 8 selected households in the village. Each set includes 2 tanks for rearing 300 tilapia fish and 40 plant pots for growing vegetables such as pak choy, water spinach (kangkung), and spinach.

This community project aims to enhance knowledge and generate income for the villagers through capacity building with technical training provided by UTeM researchers while promoting environmental sustainability through solar technology.

Programme Profile U 2024







The primary aim of this programme is to offer students valuable career exposure, enabling them to gain a deeper understanding of potential career paths.

Additionally, it seeks to improve the employability of UTeM graduates in 2024 by equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and experience necessary to succeed in the competitive job market. UTeM aims to produce approximately 30,000 skilled workforces in the TVET field. Furthermore, 'TVET PLACE & TRAIN UTeM@KPT' will also contribute to enhancing the employability of graduates (GE) with premium salaries, while also assisting communities and the nation in addressing unemployment issues and injecting sustainable economic growth into the country.

Course on Interviewing Skills for Auditors

It should be conducted in a professional manner within a short time frame to achieve the objectives. It encompasses interview strategies, psychological behaviour, questioning skills, body language, and the management of interviewees.

Official Launch of The Student Entrepreneurship Seminar 'Jom Jumpa Protege - Melaka Edition'



impressive 50 project submissions from students nationwide. In TUIC2024, UTeM secured a Silver Medal with their project "Smart Excursion Dryer".


Robotics Exhibition in Conjunction with "Kimia Ke Desa" 2024

School Holiday Program for UTeM Staff's Children



Prosthetic Leg Contribution Program for the Community





Jualan Perabot Rahmah for the Closure of Central Store



Jualan Perabot Rahmah for UTeM Staff was successfully held at the Central Store premises, UTeM Technology Campus. This program benefited over 500 UTeM staff members, allowing them to purchase second-hand items at a selling price of RM 1 per item.

An estimated total of 1,315 units were sold. The rental contract for the Central Store is set to expire on 1st August 2024, and as part of space-saving measures and risk management strategies, UTeM has decided not to renew the rental agreement for the Central Store.

Sustainable Expedition Programme: Exploring Nature at Gangsa National Primary School & Paya Rumput National Primary School



This programme is a collaboration between PTHM and UTeM, involving two schools with 85 students and 10 teachers from SK Gangsa, as well as 120 students and 15 teachers from SK Paya Rumput.

This knowledge transfer programme is conducted during the school's co-curricular activities and aims to build a strong foundation of knowledge by exposing participants to the importance of ecosystems, biodiversity, and current environmental issues, while fostering sustainable education at the grassroots level.


Placement of Fabric Recycling Bin at UTeM

PIONEER FLOOD MONITORING PROJECT AT TAMAN MASJID TANAH RIA, MASJID TANAH, MELAKA







The installation of a flood monitoring system has been successfully completed at Taman Masjid Tanah Ria, Masjid Tanah, Melaka. Led by Mr. Mazran bin Esro alongside Associate Professor Eur Ing Dr. Siva Kumar A/L Subramaniam from the Faculty of Electronic and Computer Engineering Technology (FTKEK), UTeM, the project ran from November to December 2024.

The monitoring system provides early flood warnings, delivering real-time notifications to residents and authorities via mobile applications and social media.

This initiative is a collaborative effort between the Melaka State Government and UTeM, coordinated by the RICE UTeM-Melaka Collaboration Management Center and UPEN, with support from local agencies such as the Melaka Department of Irrigation and Drainage (JPS) and the Alor Gajah Municipal Council (MPAG).

The project forms part of Melaka's strategic plan to mitigate the impact of flash floods, which frequently occur due to climate change and unpredictable rainfall patterns. The system is designed to minimize property damage and streamline rescue efforts in affected areas.

Photos captured throughout the installation process showcase the system being set up at designated locations.

Plogging Day - Let's Clean Our Lake!

Plogging at UTeM

By enhancing the cleanliness of the space, the initiative aims to promote environmental sustainability, improve public well-being, and create a more enjoyable atmosphere for visitors and the local community.

CSR Program: Community Clean-Up and Exhibition at Kuala Sungai Baru


Exploration Programme for Healthy Living
